## ACCOUNTABILITY

Killeen Police Department implemented its body worn camera program in September. The program was made possible by grant funding from the Office of the Governor, the Edward J. Byrne Memorial JAG grant and forfeiture funds. The goal of the program is to build trust with the community through increased transparency and accountability. The cameras are worn by uniformed patrol officers and all official police contacts are recorded.

# PERSONNEL AND TRAINING

The Personnel and Training Unit is responsible for recruiting and hiring of police officers and civilian staff. The Personnel Resource Officer is the department's recruiter and manages a team of part-time recruiters. The Human Resources Manager works closely with the Recruiter and fulfills the HR needs of the department.



In addition to the Basic Academy, Killeen Police Officers received training in investigations, SFST/DWI training, Active Shooter Response, Crisis Intervention, Use of Force, intermediate licensing courses and many others.

The Police Academy Training Center is licensed by the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement (TCOLE). In 2018, the 28th Basic Law Enforcement Class graduated six Cadets. This class was the 19th consecutive class to pass the state licensing exam on the first attempt—an important performance measure of academy performance by TCOLE. An additional 21 Cadets began the academy and will graduate in 2019.



# EVIDENCE PROCESSING UNIT (EPU)

The Evidence Processing Unit (EPU) is responsible for the care, custody, and control of all evidence and found/recovered property in the possession of the Killeen Police Department. EPU is also the primary unit responsible for the gathering, processing, and examination of evidence for the Police Department. EPU represents the Department in court and as liaison with other law enforcement agencies, as well as the general public on matters pertaining to property and evidence.

The EPU is staffed by a Manager, two Evidence Techs, one Evidence Tech II, a Latent Print Examiner, and a Video Evidence Technician. Evidence Technicians are responsible for the direct control, inventory and security of all property seized by members of the Department. The Latent Print Examiner compares prints collected from evidence and crime scenes to identify offenders. The Video Technician is responsible for all in-car/body-cam video to include databases, and duplication/redaction of video evidence.

Two specially-trained Digital Forensics Detectives are attached to the EPU. These Detectives process computers, phones and other electronic devices for evidence in criminal investigations.



# ANIMAL SERVICES



Killeen Animal Services is the local rabies control authority for the City of Killeen. The enforcement of state and local laws is critical in maintaining a healthy animal population.

## Significant Accomplishments

- Increased the live release rate to 90% during the calendar year.
- Killeen Animal Services increased enforcement efforts resulting in a 141% increase in confiscations of animals. Many of confiscations were the result of animal cruelty.
- 2068 Animal adoptions




For the third year in a row, the shelter was awarded a generous grant from the PETCO Foundation. Last year's award was \$80,000 to help with the shelter's life saving efforts.
