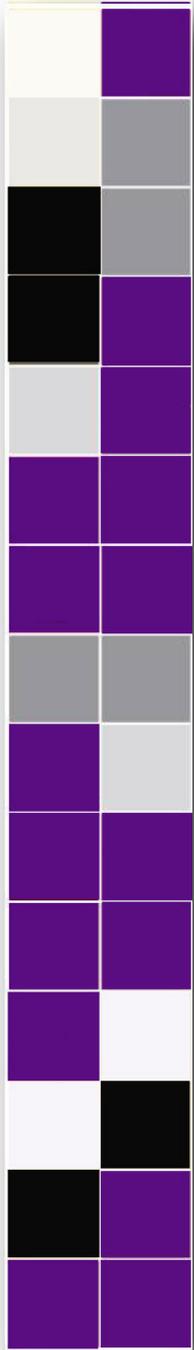

- Stakeholders are those who make and implement decisions, those who are affected by the decisions made, and those who participate in the implementation planning process


“responsibility for decision-making regarding the management of water resources is founded at the local level”

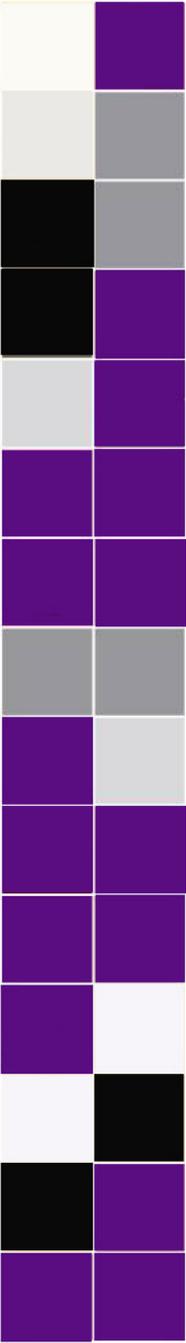

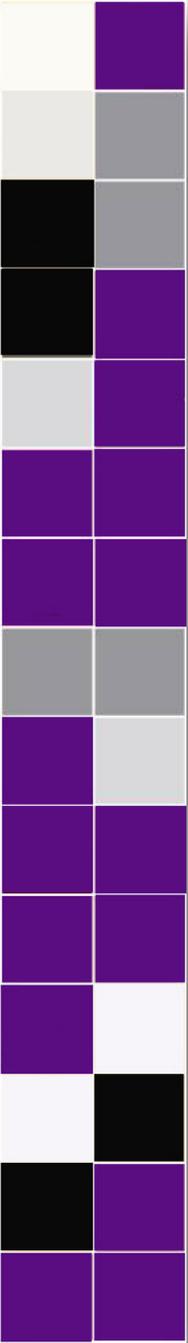




Stakeholder Group Development

- Attend meetings and project related activities






Information & Education

 - Urban Growth Workshops


