Due to the weather conditions and the flooding occurring throughout the city, the Killeen Police Department is asking everyone who will be driving today, Wednesday, September 08, 2010, to use extreme caution,. Severe flooding has caused many roadways and major intersections to be closed and will cause detours and delays. The following roadways and intersections have been closed due to water levels being unsafe for passage:

Willowsprings and Hemlock Dr.  
Imperial Dr. and Central Texas Expressway  
Clairidge and Old 440  
Watercrest Dr.  
Chapparal Rd. and Hwy 195  
Roy Reynolds south of the railroad tracks  
Alpine and Hwy 195  
505 Dimple  
Twin Creek Rd and the railroad tracks  
38<sup>th</sup> St. below the overhead railroad track near Killeen High School  
Illinois Ave. between Grey Fox and Goode  
Terrace and Redondo  
Elms Rd. and Cunningham  
W.S. Young Dr. and Illinois Ave  
W.S. Young Dr. and Becker  
Featherline between Chaparral Rd. and Stagecoach Rd.  
24<sup>th</sup> St. and Harris Ave.  
Reeses Creek Rd.  
Mustang and Indy  
28<sup>th</sup> St between Veterans Memorial Blvd and Greenwood  
Hallmark and Santa Rosa Dr.  
W.S. Young between Elms Rd. and Stan Schlueter Blvd  
Elms Rd. and Robinett Dr.

Numerous vehicles were towed after they were left in the roadway due to the high water. The Killeen Fire and Police Departments evacuated approximately 100 people from their homes overnight and they were taken to the Killeen Community Center for shelter. Everyone is asked to drive safely if they need to get out today but to stay off the roadways if they can.

The water continues to rush over roadways, please do not try to pass when this is seen – “TURN AROUND – DON’T DROWN”
