

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KILLEEN, TEXAS POSTPONING THE SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON MAY 2, 2020, FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSIDERING A COMBINED PROPOSITION ABOLISHING THE ADDITIONAL SALES AND USE TAX WITHIN THE CITY OF KILLEEN AND ADOPTING A SALES AND USE TAX WITHIN THE CITY OF KILLEEN AT A RATE OF ONE AND ONE-HALF PERCENT TO THE NOVEMBER 3, 2020, UNIFORM ELECTION DATE; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, in accordance with the general laws and Constitution of the State of Texas and the Charter of the City of Killeen, Texas, and pursuant to Ordinance No. 20-004, a special election was ordered to be held on May 2, 2020, for the purpose of considering a combined proposition abolishing the additional sales and use tax within the City of Killeen and adopting a sales and use tax within the City of Killeen at a rate of one and one-half percent, and;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 418.016 of the Texas Government Code, on March 18, 2020, the Governor of the State of Texas signed a proclamation suspending certain provisions of the Texas Election Code to allow all local political subdivisions that are utilizing the May 2, 2020, uniform election date to postpone their elections to the November 3, 2020, uniform election date, and;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Governor's proclamation authorizing the City of Killeen to postpone the May 2, 2020, election date, the City Council does by this ordinance exercise its authority to postpone the special election ordered for May 2, 2020, for the purpose of considering a combined proposition abolishing the additional sales and use tax within the City of Killeen and adopting a sales and use tax within the City of Killeen at a rate of one and one-half percent to November 3, 2020.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KILLEEN:

SECTION 1. That the special election previously ordered for May 2, 2020, for the City of Killeen, Texas, for the purpose of considering a combined proposition abolishing the additional sales and use tax within the City of Killeen and adopting a sales and use tax within the City of Killeen at a rate of one and one-half percent is hereby postponed to November 3, 2020.

SECTION 2. That all marked ballots received by Federal Post Card Application voters and other voters who are eligible for early voting because they are voting from outside the United States will still be valid for the November 3, 2020 postponed election date.

SECTION 3. That all annual applications for ballot by mail (ABBM) for voters that are voting by mail due to being over the age of 65 or due to disability will still be valid for the November 3, 2020, election; and that ABBM for voters who submitted ABBM based on expected absence from the county shall not be valid for the postponed November 3, 2020, election.

SECTION 4. That the voter registration deadline for the November 3, 2020, election is October 5, 2020, the deadline to submit an ABBM is October 23, 2020, and the dates for early voting are October 19, 2020, through October 30, 2020.

SECTION 5. Returns of election shall be made by the election officers to the City Council at a meeting following the election; the returns will be canvassed and the results of the election declared as prescribed by the Election Code, V.T.C.A., of the State of Texas and the City Charter.


SECTION 6. It is officially found, determined, and declared that the meeting at which this Ordinance has been adopted was open to the public and public notice of the time, place, and subject matter of the public business to be considered and acted upon at the meeting, including this Ordinance, was given, all as required by the applicable provisions of the Texas Government Code, Sec. 551.001, *et seq.*

SECTION 7. That should any section or part of any section or paragraph of this ordinance be declared invalid or unconstitutional for any reason, it shall not invalidate or impair the validity, force or effect of any other section or sections or part of a section or paragraph of this ordinance.

SECTION 8. That this ordinance shall be effective immediately upon passage.





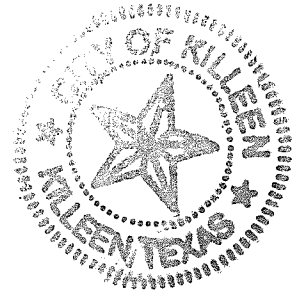

CITY COUNCIL MEMORANDUM FOR ORDINANCE

SUBJECT: Postponing the May 2, 2020 Special Election to November 3, 2020

BACKGROUND AND FINDINGS:

City Council approved ordinance 20-004 calling a special election to be held May 2, 2020, for the purpose of considering a combined proposition abolishing the additional sales and use tax within the City of Killeen and adopting a sales and use tax within the City of Killeen at a rate of one and one-half percent.

In response to COVID-19, on March 18, 2020, the Governor of the State of Texas signed a proclamation suspending certain provisions of the Texas Election Code to allow all local political subdivisions that are utilizing the May 2, 2020, uniform election date to postpone their elections to the November 3, 2020, uniform election date. The postponement of an election does not happen automatically; the City Council must take official action for such a change to be effective.

Pursuant to Texas Election Advisory No. 2020-12 issued by the Texas Secretary of State, there will be no change to the current candidate filings; all ballot by mail requests that were filed for the May 2, 2020, election marked annual would apply for the November 3, 2020, election; all single ballot by mail requests submitted for reasons of age or disability would still be valid for the November 3, 2020, election; single use ballot by mail applications submitted due to absence from the county would not be valid (a letter will be submitted to the voter advising of the invalidity); and marked ballots that are received by Federal Post Card Application voters (military members serving overseas and out of the county) and other voters who are eligible for early voting because they are voting from outside the United States will still be valid and will be counted for the November 3, 2020, election date.

The attached ordinance has been prepared postponing the special election to November 3, 2020.

THE ALTERNATIVES CONSIDERED:

The alternatives considered is to hold a May 2, 2020, election or to postpone the election to November 3, 2020.

CONFORMITY TO CITY POLICY:
