

**LEAD & COPPER RULE MONITORING AND REPORTING VIOLATION  
MANDATORY LANGUAGE - TIER III**

**IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER**

The City of Killeen has violated the monitoring and reporting requirements set by Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) in Chapter 30, Section 290, Subchapter F. Even though these were not emergencies, as our customers, you have the right to know what happened and what we did to correct these situations.

*Due to the introduction of a new source water, the City of Killeen was required to complete four quarterly sampling events of Water Quality Parameter (WQP) sampling. These monitoring events were not required because of a public health emergency. Results of this monitoring indicate whether the blending of two separate sources of water has the potential to affect the corrosivity of the City's drinking water. During the second quarter of 2022, April 1 - June 30, we did not collect twenty-nine WQP samples and therefore could not provide TCEQ test results for this sampling event. The City of Killeen collected and monitored fifty-eight additional samples across the next two subsequent quarters for 2022 beyond what TCEQ required thus bringing the City into compliance. All prior Lead & Copper and WQP data has shown no issues with corrosivity, but these remaining base line samples were necessary for TCEQ to make its determination.*

The table below lists the contaminant(s) we did not properly test for during the last year, how often we are supposed to sample for [these contaminants], how many samples we are supposed to take, how many samples we took, when samples should have been taken, and the date on which the follow-up samples were taken.
